Report of the Trustees

Governing Document

Scottish Local History Forum is a charitable unincorporated association and its purpose and administration arrangements are set out in the constitution. The constitution was adopted on 3^{rd} September 1994 and last amended on 12^{th} November 2010. The Forum is managed by a committee of trustees who are appointed at the Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the Forum.

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Scottish Local History Forum is a registered charity in Scotland. Trustees are elected at the AGM which shall be held no earlier than 1 August and no later than 30 November each year. Members shall elect a minimum of 6 and a maximum of 12 trustees to serve for the next year. They will retire at each AGM but may stand for re-election. Consultation with representatives of member societies is achieved through an Advisory Committee (nominated by the member societies and appointed by the Trustees) which meets twice a year. It currently consists of:

- Linda Clark (North Kessock and District Local History Society)
- Seamus Coleman (Croy Historical Society)
- Helena Koumbouzis (Milngavie and Bearsden Historical Society)
- Alan Provan (Elie and Earlsferry History Society)
- Graham Roberts (Dumfries Archives)
- David Smith (LOCSCOT).

Management

The trustees are responsible for the strategic direction and governance of the Forum. The Trustees Committee met seven times in the year to 31st July 2014.

A new committee structure was established from March 2011, with various smaller sub-committees and working groups formed as required to focus on particular topics. Sub-committees' members are trustees and/or volunteer members. The sub-committees active during the year were:

- Publications Board Journal (responsible for editing the journal)
- Publications Board E-newsletter (responsible for editing the e-newsletter)
- Website Sub-Committee (responsible for development of and administration of the website)
- Advisory Committee (providing input and advice to the Trustees from member societies).

The aims of The Forum are to advance the heritage of Scotland and education in Scottish local history, without distinction of political, religious or other opinions, by associating historical societies, local authorities, voluntary organisations, educational institutions and individuals in a common effort to pursue this object by the stimulation of public interest and encouragement of high standards in education through the medium of meetings, publications, exhibitions and conferences.

Activities and Achievements

The financial results for the year are set out in the attached accounts. Three colour issues of the journal were produced during the year. The Forum organised a seminar/ guided walk as well as the annual conference in October 2013 "Trades and Crafts in Scotland – Medieval to Modern Day". The Forum continued to attract advertisers in its Journal which helped fund the website development and makes it possible to produce a high quality colour Journal and has expanded the number of outlets for distributing its Journal.

As planned, the Forum utilised some of its accumulated reserves for a long overdue investment in the redevelopment of the website which now takes online orders and credit card payments for events, membership and back-issues. We expect the ability to pay online to attract overseas members. The revenue for the year was slightly up compared with last year and despite the

significant investment in the website (and late payment of several large invoices which will therefore fall into the next financial year), the Forum ended the financial year with comfortable reserves.

In addition an e-newsletter was launched this year which is emailed to members approximately every two months (and is available online in our website).

The membership figures remain good, despite the economic climate, cut backs in spending by public bodies such as libraries and archives, and the inevitable "ageing" of our individual membership base.

Trustee Remuneration and Expense

The trustees did not receive any remuneration during the year and expenses only to cover those incurred as a direct result of Forum business.

Financial Review

The results for the period are set out in the attached accounts which show a deficit of £3,117 (2013 was surplus of £3,903).

Reserves Policy

The Forum's current policy on reserves is to have funds equivalent to the costs of producing 2 issues of the journal and holding the AGM.

Plans for the Future

- Publications
 - 3 issues of Scottish Local History in August and December 2014 and February 2015.
- Events
 - An annual conference & AGM in October 2014 ("On the Wrong Side of the Law 300 years of Crime and Punishment in Scotland".
- Website
 - Further Development depending on result of grant application or funding availability.
- Expanding the membership
 - Aiming to contact past members and overseas organisations (now that online payment is possible).

Independent Examiner's Report to the trustees of Scottish Local History Forum

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 July 2014 which are set out on pages 5 and 6.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006.
